A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends -

This past year was one that saw the growth, reach, and impact of The Cabot expand in an incredibly meaningful way. It is our hope that our first ever annual report will paint you a picture of what the year looked like from all of us who were here to experience it.

Today, The Cabot looks like a very different place than it did when I arrived in Beverly in October of 2015. After finally figuring out how to turn on the lights and find my way around the theater, which ate up most of my first few days on the job, I quickly realized that this was a truly unique, once in a lifetime project in a very special and supportive community.

Since that time, The Cabot has taken off like a rocket ship; our capital campaign to raise \$6.8 million in funds to fully renovate the theater by the end of 2020, our 100th birthday, is well underway. We have increased annual attendance by over 200% and have raised the bar for arts and culture in Beverly through our performing arts, public art, and educational programs. We have helped our neighbors through our nonprofit partnerships with organizations like Root, Pathways for Children, Montserrat College of Art, Essex County Community Foundation, Beyond Walls, Northshore Recovery High School, and many others. Our economic impact on Downtown Beverly was close to \$7 million in FY19. And there is more we can do!

As we look to 2020 and beyond, we foresee incredible things. We will continue to build on our successes from 2019, including our Cabot 99 event which raised \$1 million toward the restoration and updating of our historic lobby. The theater's lobby, which has not been seen by the public in over 50 years, will be named for our Chairman Emeritus, Steve Dodge. We keep Steve's memory in our hearts and minds as we do this work. We thank you for your partnership and support as we continue to grow this wonderful organization and see it through its exciting 100th year.

AN EXPERIENCE LIKE NO OTHER

The Cabot Theater, a North Shore treasure, is a legacy of the visionary showmanship and architectural passion of North Shore residents, the Ware Brothers. The Theater opened on December 8, 1920 as a dream palace for vaudeville and silent movies and it was hailed as "the most impressive auditorium of its size east of New York."

Today, The Cabot is a rare survivor. When the Cabot Performing Arts Center reopened its doors in 2014 after being vacant for two years, it was no less than a rescue mission. Out of the 20,000 grand movie palaces that once existed across the country, fewer than 250 remain.

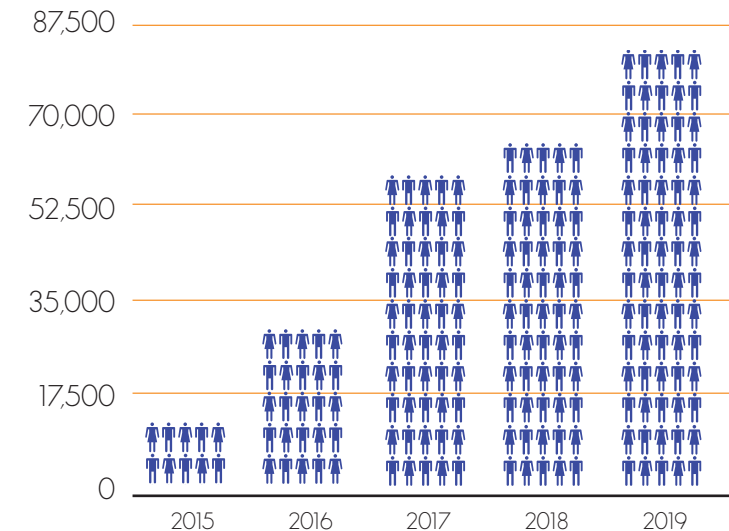

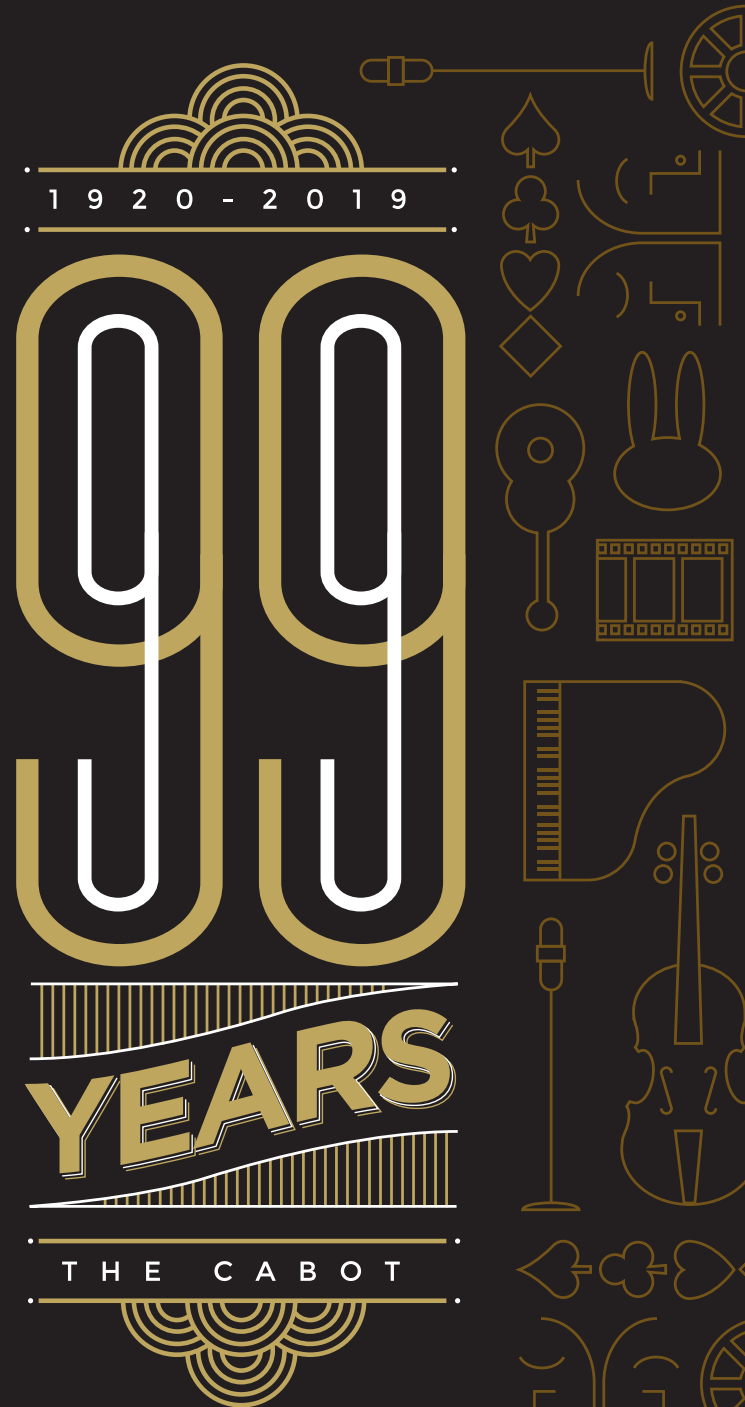

TRANSFORMING THE CABOT

Thanks to your help, The Cabot is better than ever!

Streetside at The Cabot Created a funky, comfortable, and modern gathering place for sponsors, community events, and members. **\$260,000**
Completed 2017

Upgrade The Cabot Infrastructure Replaced the aging and inefficient HVAC system, reinforced the roof, and added a state-of-the-art sprinkler system for increased safety. **\$2,140,000**
Completed 2018

Refurbish the Balcony and Upgrade the Lighting and Sound Systems Added new and wider seats, access to the original opera boxes, and new lighting and safety features so that the balcony is as beautiful and comfortable as the orchestra level. Upgraded the theatrical rigging system, lighting and sound for an enhanced patron experience during live performances. **\$800,000**

CABOT 100 PROJECTS TO BE COMPLETED

Return the Lobby to its original grandeur by exposing and restoring the original rose window, vaulted ceilings, and opulent neoclassical chandelier. Create a more spacious and upgraded box office, concessions and bar area to address the needs of today's audience. **\$750,000**
Scheduled to be Completed: Fall 2020

Ensure that The Cabot is Accessible for all by installing an elevator to the 2nd Floor Pavilion, modifying doorways and hallways, and creating access to the stage so that The Cabot is ADA compliant. **\$650,000**

Modernize the Artist and Patron Experience including the renovation and addition of restrooms, upgrading the artist Green Rooms, and the addition of surround sound in the main theater. **\$650,000**

Restore and enhance the façade The Cabot will add new windows, glass canopies and banners as well as replace the roof. **\$750,000**

THE CABOT LOBBY PROJECT

The Cabot's lobby urgently needs restoration to uncover the beautiful architectural details that make it an emblematic and rare example of a 1920s-era movie palace. We plan to restore the high vaulted ceilings and original rose window, recapturing the sweeping grandeur of the original entryway. The finished lobby will be named after The Dodge Family in honor of Board Chair Emeritus, Steven B. Dodge.

In addition to historical rehabilitation of these architectural gems, we plan to make substantial updates to the rest of the lobby, making it more comfortable, inviting, and functional for Cabot patrons. These updates will include the addition of an elevator that will make the second floor lobby accessible to our entire community.

In addition to the lobby renovations, there is much work to be done! Join our community as we raise the funds for the restoration and enhancement of the building's facade, replacement of the roof, and additional restrooms and other patron amenities so The Cabot can be enjoyed for generations to come.

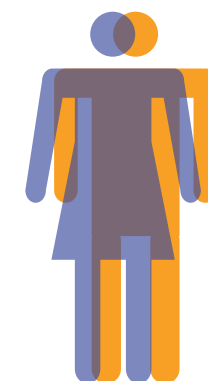
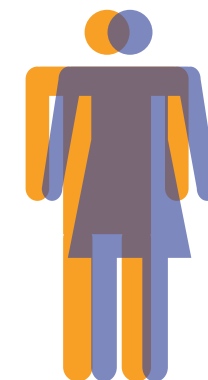
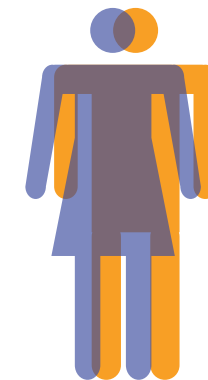

PUBLIC ART COMES TO THE CABOT

It would be hard to miss the two new murals on The Cabot's exterior. During the summer of 2019 a committee of local business leaders and community members invited artists to paint murals that would embody our historic legacy in downtown Beverly and set the tone for the growth ahead of us.

The new murals exist alongside the murals from Le Grand David and His Own Spectacular Magic Company, which held shows in The Cabot for over 35 years. On our north-facing wall, Alex Senna's mural entitled "Dreamers" pays tribute to the many artists who have visited The Cabot and inspired us all to dream a little bigger. On the south-facing wall, Helen Bur's mural illustrates how the performing and visual arts, and all that they bring to our lives, uplift the community.

THE CABOT IS GOING GREEN!
